ESSEX vs DEVON

Newly promoted Devon was the visitors to Chelmsford Social Club for the second BICC Premier fixture of the season and gave Essex a superb test of character.

The **Ladies 'B'** fought out a 3-3 draw with 3-2 victories from Lynn Kelly (16.94) and Nicky Mynard (18.54); followed by lady of the match, Lauren Bloomfield (24.25) securing the draw.

The **Men's 'B'** continue their 14 match unbeaten run with a 9-3 triumph. Wayne Bloomfield (Clacton) returned to the team and won 4-3; Chelmsford's Andrew Kateley (31.81) put in a man of the match performance winning 4-0; Southend Ekco's Michael McCombe (30.36) won the 4th set 4-0; losing out was Eddie Gosling, Chris Gower and Liam Pender. Essex then turned the screw by winning all six set in the second half; Southend's Paul Marsh (27.62), Ritchie Edhouse (30.33) and Barry Lynn (25.45) all recording great wins, with Rayleigh Rascal's Michael Peel (26.69), Tony Osborne (Brightlingsea) and Robbie Turner (Springfield) giving the 'B's a 9-3 win to send them to the top of their league.

Going into Sunday with a 12-6 lead and the **Ladies 'A'** didn't disappoint against a very strong Devon ladies team.
