DORSET vs ESSEX

Another away game saw Essex travel to Poole and not a great weekend for our Ladies.

The **Ladies 'B'**, who'd over the pasted few matches had shown some improvement, didn't have any luck, they were only a point behind their opponents prior to the fixture, but only won one-set. Steph Hewson was unlucky to suffer her first 'B' team loss as she was unlucky to lose the opening set 3-2; Chelmsford's Pauline Donat (18.41) won the second and only set.

Not a great start for the **Ladies 'A'** as Leanne Peetoom and previously unbeaten Stacey Ellis both lost out 3-1. Clacton's Karen Breen (20.58) produced her best ever performance in an Essex shirt winning 3-1; but Lynn Kelly lost out in straight sets. A lady of the match performance from Chelmsford's Sue Baker (22.77) kept Essex alive; however, Donna Gleed couldn't find that winning double and lost the 6th set 3-2.

The Men's 'A' needed to win to avoid a weekend defeat, but it wasn't to be; Steve Johnson lost the opening set 4-2, Brightlingsea's Alan Collins (21.95) and Southend's Wayne Bloomfield (28.04) won the next two sets; but Dorset took the next 3-set as Phil Brewster Wayne Gleed and Paul Marsh all suffered losses.
