The first BICC Premier fixture of the new season saw Essex visit newly promoted Hampshire.

**Ladies 'B'** got Essex off to a good start with a draw; Pauline Donat won the opening set with a 3-1 win, Lynn Kelly (21.72) laid claim to the match award winning 3-1 also, before debutant Lauren Bloomfield (19.61) secured the draw winning the final set 3-1 and scoring a 180. The **Men's 'B'** look stronger than last season and continued their 13 match unbeaten run with a 9-3 victory.
