ESSEX vs NORTHAMPTONSHIRE

Chelmsford Social Club played host to the first fixture of 2019 which witnessed Essex recording their first win of the season.

The **Ladies 'B'** lost the opening set, before Leanne Peetoom (17.92) lay claim to the lady of the match winning 3-2; Nicky Bewick (14.96) won the next set 3-1. Essex lost set 4 & 5; however, Sharon Wakeling won the final set 3-1 to give Essex a deserved 3-all draw.

The **Men's 'B'** continue to struggle and found themselves 5-0 down before putting a point on the board, that was man of the match Bryan Margerison (28.33) winning 4-1. Tony Osborne (27.49) won 4-2 and Danny McIntyre (24.27) won 4-3 to pull Essex back to 5-3; but Essex only won two more sets from Lennie Holmes (22.67) winning 4-2 on his return to the team and debutant Allan Mathieson (23.50) also winning 4-2, therefore Essex found themselves 10-8 down going into Sunday's 'A' team games.

The **Ladies 'A'** got Essex in-front for the first time since the 3rd set Saturday morning, with Stacey Ellis (24.86) winning 3-1, and taking the ladies prize money & match award in the opening set; this was following by 3-2 victories by Donna Gleed (19.73), Karen Breen (14.31) and Pauline Donat (19.18); Sue Baker (18.33) won the final set to give the ladies a 5-1 win.

This gave the **Men's 'A'** a great platform to win their first game of the season and they took full advantage winning the opening three sets all 4-3; Phil Halls (27365), Steve Johnson (26.70) and Phil Brewster (28.13) on his 100th appearance for the county. Essex won only one of the next four sets, but it was a memorable tussle between Wayne Bloomfield (31.10) and Northamptonshire's Ricky Evans (31.09) which saw Wayne triumphant 4-2 and claiming the £150 prize money and match award. Both Southend stars John Costigan (23.86) and Paul Marsh (25.76) won 4-0 and 4-3 respectively; and Essex won the final two sets with victories from Andrew Kateley (28.73) winning 4-3 and Darren Peetoom (26.46) winning 4-1.

Result was Essex 24 Northamptonshire 15 which lifted Essex off the bottom of the premier table and on the same points as West Midland's, who lay in 8th place.
