WARWICKSHIRE vs ESSEX

Our visit to Coventry didn't go to plan as Warwickshire extended their lead over Essex to 11-points.

It wasn't for the want of trying, the **Ladies 'B'** had chances to win their match; Nicky Mynard and Charlotte Halls both lost out 3-2 in very close contests. Stephanie Hewson won 3-0 and the returning Sharon Hawkins won 3-2 to claim the lady of the match award; however Essex lost the last two sets to lose out 4-2 and drop back to the bottom of the table.

The **Men's 'B'** are getting better and better each match; although Orsett's Liam Pender lost the opening set, Essex rattled off the next four-sets with 4-1 wins from Southend's Dave Solly (26.22), Paul Marsh and Stephen Hardy; and Riverside's Sam Lepley (26.15) a 4-3 victory.
